Syllabus for Music

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Objective

The objective of this class is to develop student growth using music as a medium and to enhance students' personal experiences with music. The objective is <u>not</u> only to create professional musicians that read standard notation and play instruments or sing. Although we do focus on music literacy and performing, this class will also explore things not related to performing music such as music of other cultures/time periods, listening skills, personal connections to music, the science of sound, and much more! In addition to this, I believe that music offers a wealth of opportunities for personal as well as interpersonal growth, life skills, and cultural development. It is my intention to nurture growth in these areas through music and to help students to create connections to music that will last a lifetime.

These percentages provide a general representation of the weight each category can be expected to have on a students grade each trimester.

After it is offered, students have until the end of the trimester to submit it for credit. Some extra participation points may be earned along the way by exceeding expectations in class (see Participation Rubric).

Policies
